



A workshop on "SPSS Data Entry and Analysis: A Practical Approach for Beginners" was conducted on 7<sup>th</sup> November 2024 at the Digital library, HITEC-IMS. The purpose of the workshop was to to enhance statistical skills among faculty from Basic and clinical sciences. Led by Dr Wajiha Mah Jabeen, in charge Research cell, the session provided a hands-on introduction to SPSS, with practical exercises reinforcing learning.



Key Learning Objectives are Understand the SPSS interface, learn data entry, variable definition, and basic transformations, conduct descriptive statistics and apply basic inferential tests

The workshop successfully achieved its objectives, providing participants with foundational skills in SPSS. The interactive sessions and practical exercises were well-received, enabling participants to apply statistical methods effectively in their research.

#### **WORKSHOP ON SURGICAL SKILLS**

The of General Surgery Department organized a workshop on "FNAC/ Trucut Biopsy Techniques and Barrel Bandage TMJ **Application** for Dislocation Management" on 22<sup>nd</sup> Nov 2024 for the 5thyear MBBS students continuing a tradition of the past four years. The primary goal of the workshop was to offer hands-on training, providing students with practical exposure beyond the traditional classroom setting.



The workshop began with an introduction to the procedures, followed by live demonstrations on FNAC/Trucut biopsy techniques and the application of the barrel bandage after the reduction of TMJ dislocation. Students were then divided into groups, with Dr. Tehniat, Dr. Hasnain, Dr. Hassan, Dr. Abdullah, and Dr. Nayab overseeing the hands-on activities at their respective stations. Dr Areej a representative from medical education department also attended the session. their learnings, followed by a group photograph and feedback collection. The event was a resounding success and was highly appreciated by the students.

### **WORKSHOP ON FIRE EXTINGUISHERS**

A Fire drill Workshop was conducted on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2024 in Dental College lecture Hall 3. All faculty members including House Officers, Staff and BDS students attended the training session.
